MEMORIAL CENTENARY A service of rededication is to held on Friday 4 October to mark the centenary of the Portsmouth Naval Memorial on Southsea Common. The memorial was the last of the three great memorials to sailors lost at sea in the World Wars - Chatham's was unveiled on 26 April 1924, Plymouth's on 29 July the same year and Portsmouth's on 15 October. The memorials, situated at the Royal Navy's three 'manning ports', are almost identical, built around giant obelisks that act as leading marks for shipping. ROYAL OAK A memorial service marking the 85th anniversary of the loss of battleship HMS Royal Oak will be held on The Hard in Portsmouth on Sunday 6 October, starting at 1100. The service will include the unveiling of a 2.3m obelisk. Royal Oak was sunk in Scapa Flow on 14 October 1939 by submarine U-47, with the loss of 835 men and boys.
