UP AND AWAY UK Space Command has launched its first military satellite. Under SpaceX's dedicated smallsat rideshare programme, the Tyche satellite was launched from Vandenberg Space Force Base in California. Tyche, the size of washing machine, will support military operations, capturing daytime images and videos of the Earth's surface, strengthening the UK's Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) capabilities. It is the first of a constellation of satellites that will also contribute to other government tasks, including natural disaster monitoring and mapping. Please be in position at the Lisbon Maru Memorial by 11.45am. For those who have difficulty walking there will be shuttle buses available to take people to and from the Memorial, and there will be seating at the Memorial for those who have difficulty standing. The service will be led by Pastor Jean Clements, whose uncle Kenneth Hodkinson of the Royal Scots was one of the victims of the disaster. It will be a short and simple service and will include readings of poetry by some of the survivors. Representatives of service associations are welcome to lay wreaths, as are relatives and friends of those who suffered on the Lisbon Maru. Unlike last year there will not be a reception after the service, but there are good catering facilities in the main building of the NMA, the Remembrance Centre.
