LISBON MARU FILM The film 'The Sinking of The Lisbon Maru' is to be shown as the closing film in the Electric Shadows 2024 Chinese film festival at the Phoenix Theatre, Leicester, on 1 December at 6.30pm.

The film is a documentary, directed by Fang Li, that sheds light on events of 1 October 1942, when Japanese transport ship Lisbon Maru, carrying more than 1,800 British prisoners of war, was torpedoed off China by an American submarine that was unaware of its 'passengers'. Chinese fishermen risked their lives to rescue almost 400 prisoners from the ship, though more than 800 POWs died.
